

## Behavior Analysis Specialist II

The Department of Psychology at the Munroe-Meyer Institute of Genetics and Rehabilitation seeks a full-time behavior analyst to join its School-Based Intensive Behavior Consultation team. The Munroe-Meyer Institute is a part of the University of Nebraska Medical Center located in Omaha, NE. The team currently provides behavior consultation to school teams for students with intellectual and developmental disabilities who engage in severe behaviors (e.g., aggression, self-injury, destruction). The team is comprised of a faculty Psychologist/Behavior Analyst; post-doctoral trainees in applied behavior analysis and psychology; pre-doctoral interns in psychology; graduate students from various educational programs who are seeking training to become board certified behavior analysts; and the Behavior Analysis Specialist II. We work as a team to support the needs of the students via obtained school-based contracts.

### Major Responsibilities:

1. Respond to referrals of students with intellectual and developmental disabilities who are engaging in severe behaviors by conducting behavior assessment (e.g., descriptive assessment, experimental analyses), work with the school team to develop a behavior intervention plan, and the provide staff training as needed.
2. Develop and deliver didactic training to school staff on classroom management, evidence-based interventions for students with intellectual and developmental disabilities, and other topic areas to support educator and student success in the classroom environment.
3. If the individual has enough experience, they will also support the supervision of graduate students or pre-doctoral interns in psychology who are working to become Board Certified Behavior Analysts.
4. Scholarship opportunities (e.g., presentation at conferences, writing manuscripts, etc.) would also be available to the candidate as desired.

### Minimum Qualifications

- Master's degree in related field such as psychology, applied behavior analysis, or special education from an accredited institution.
- Certification at the Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) level (or certified eligible)
- One year's relevant experience
